A Parish meeting this day held at
Clodock Church after public notice given on
Sunday last. Immediately after Divine Service
we the Vestrymen and Landholders present
as listed in the Church and Chapel Warden
of the several Townships of Crapwall, Lanymore
Crapwall and Sturton to make a Rate of
three pence in the pound, on all lands within
in the said Townships for the purpose of repairing
the Church & Chapels belonging to the said
Townships

Open of two meetings 1836

at a meeting held this 4th day of
January 1833 at the chapel of Crap
wall & adjourned from thence to
the house of George Brentnall in
the township of Crapwall, after due
notice given at the Church & Chapels in
the parish of Clodock - on the Sunday
preceding.

Resolved that the undersigned on
behalf of the parish resolved to allow
the sum of twelve pounds over & above
any payments already incurred to
the Rev^d Thomas Thursty towards repairs
& alterations in the Chapel & Chapel of
