 and rate payers within the said parish  
 whose names are under written as also  
 a rate of sixpence in the pound on all  
 rateable property within the said parish  
 to be collected by the Churchwardens for  
 the purpose of assisting the inhabitants of  
 the Township of Newton to build an  
 Episcopal Chapel in the said Township  
 of Newton the rate to be collected when  
 the walls of the Chapel are raised three  
 feet high

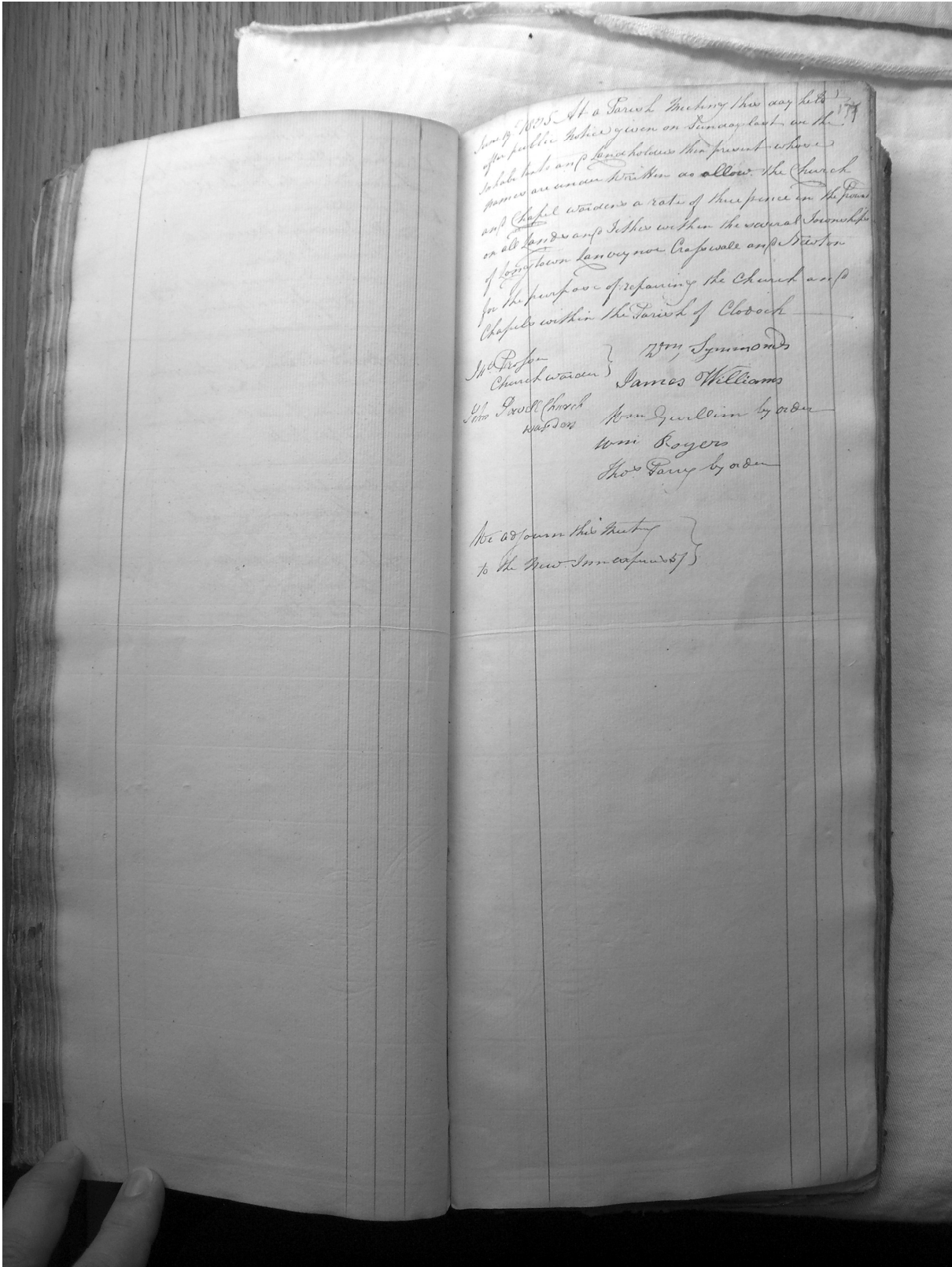
