That David Ben by Indenture bearing date the 30th day of November in the third year of the reign of our late soveraigne lord King James the sixt and Hedeoth of the lord of this manor All the several parcels of land called by the name of Wains ylast & Bylens now in the possession of William Proffer containing by estimation forty acres & also one parcel of meadow containing ab^o three acres & nine acres of arable or pasture ground lying within the jurisdiction of this manor of the yearly value of 05 - 04 for the lives of William Deuall William Proffer & John Proffer the two Proffers are now living & during yearly to the lord of this manor for the same the rent or summe of nine shillings & four pence all munday & lady day & one couple of hoo & agons all the feast of S. Thomas the apostle yearly

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That Shillix David by Indenture bearing date the 30th day of January 1687 Hedeoth of the lord of this manor All that messuages or tenements w^{ch} the chapel tenement & nine parcels of land arable meadow & pasture now in the possession of John Proffer containing by estimation 38 acres lying within the jurisdiction of this manor of the yearly value of 03 - 16 for the lives of Shillix Blamh & John Proffer & daughters of the Proffers all now living & during yearly to the lord of this manor for the same the rent or summe of three shillings & six pence all lady day & munday & one couple of good quint & travens all the feast of S. Thomas the apostle yearly w^{ch} quint & travens are measured & bounded as follows w^{ch} east & south to the lands of John Deuall & West to the lands of in Thomas Deuall North to the lane leading from St. Peter church to Monithy & Deuall called Deuall & Deuall the five mentioned in this lease to be pd. to the lord of the manor is 55

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That the same Thomas David by indenture bearing date the 30th day of January 1687 holdeth of the lord of this Manor all that piece of pasture ground called the Park now in the possession of John Dymond containing by estimation fifteen acres lying within the jurisdiction of this Court of the yearly value of 07-10 for the hire of the miller & John Sen & daughter of the same all now living — Paying yearly to the lord of this Manor for the same the rent or sum of two shillings & six pence at Lady day & Michaelmas which p[er]misses are measured & bounded as followeth East & South to the lands of the same John Dymond North to the lands of Humphrey Shaw the fine mentioned in the lease to be paid to the lord of the Manor for the p[er]misses is 35

That James Whitkin doted by indenture bearing date the 30th day of November 1687 holdeth of the lord of this Manor eight p[ar]ts or parcels of land called the Harrow divided into two pieces the lower part called the Harrow now divided into four p[ar]ts & is now in the possession of Robert Watkins his widow containing by estimation four & thirty acres lying within the jurisdiction of this Court of the yearly value of 03-00 for the hire of the miller & his sister now married to Simon Thomas of Breckon & Joseph Dymond son of William Dymond of Eton in the county of Hereford all now living but the p[er]misses paying yearly to the lord of this Manor for the same the rent or sum of four shillings at Michaelmas only & a couple of huns of hares on S^t Thomas's day yearly which p[er]misses are measured & bounded as followeth on the West to the lands of John Jeffrey of Eton North East to a way leading from Ewyas Lacy to Longdon East & South to the lands of John Dymond in the possession of John Dymond the fine mentioned in the lease to be paid to the lord of this Manor for the p[er]misses is 55 the p[er]misses are now held by

That John Morgan doted now Job Wotton — by indenture bearing date the 25th day of February 1687 holdeth of the lord of this Manor two p[ar]ts or parcels of arable land containing about 10 acres & one p[ar]t or parcel of meadow ground containing about 5 acres now in the possession of Thomas Dymond lying within the jurisdiction of this Court of the yearly value of 09-04 for the hire of the miller Job Dymond of Newbury married to Joseph the son of William Dymond of Eton in Hereford the p[er]misses only is paid paying yearly to the lord of this Manor for the same the rent or sum of two shillings & six pence at Lady day & Michaelmas & a couple of huns of hares at the feast of S^t Thomas yearly which p[er]misses are measured & bounded as followeth East to the River Monow South to the Doon land West to the way leading North to the way leading toward Longdon the fine mentioned in the lease to be paid to the lord of this Manor for the p[er]misses is 40
