 proviso contained in a certain Deed of Defiance bearing date the twenty third
 day of July one thousand eight hundred and nineteen and made between the said
 James Wright and William Gwilem of the one part and the said James Johnson
 publican of the other part to which said James Wright and William Gwilem
 by Thomas Richards Watkins of the City of Hereford Gentleman their attorney
 lawfully constituted the said Lord by his said Toward according to the custom
 of the said manor granted seizen of all and singular the aforesaid premises
 with the appurtenances by the Rod To hold the same with the appurtenances
 unto the said James Wright and William Gwilem their heirs and assigns
 during the lives aforesaid and the life of the longest liver of them at the vice of
 the Lord and according to the custom of the said manor but subject nevertheless
 to the condition or proviso contained in the said Deed of Defiance And
 whereas the said James Wright departed this life in or about the month of
 April one thousand eight hundred and twenty one leaving the said William
 Gwilem him surviving And whereas upon an account this day stated
 between the said William Gwilem and the said James Johnson publican
 there appears to be due and owing to the said William Gwilem upon and by
 virtue of the said Securities for principal Money the sum of five hundred and
 sixty pounds and no more all interest having been paid which said sum the
 said James Johnson publican has requested the said William Gwilem
 to receive and to surrender the said premises as hereinafter mentioned
 Now at this Court comes the said William Gwilem by John Mason his
 attorney lawfully constituted for that purpose by a power of attorney bearing
 date the fifth day of May one thousand eight hundred and twenty three

 under all other customs and services therefore due and of right accustomed
 And the said James Johnson publican paid to the said Lord the sum of
 Forty shillings for an Heriot and is thereupon admitted Tenant of the said
 premises and his Heathy is respited.

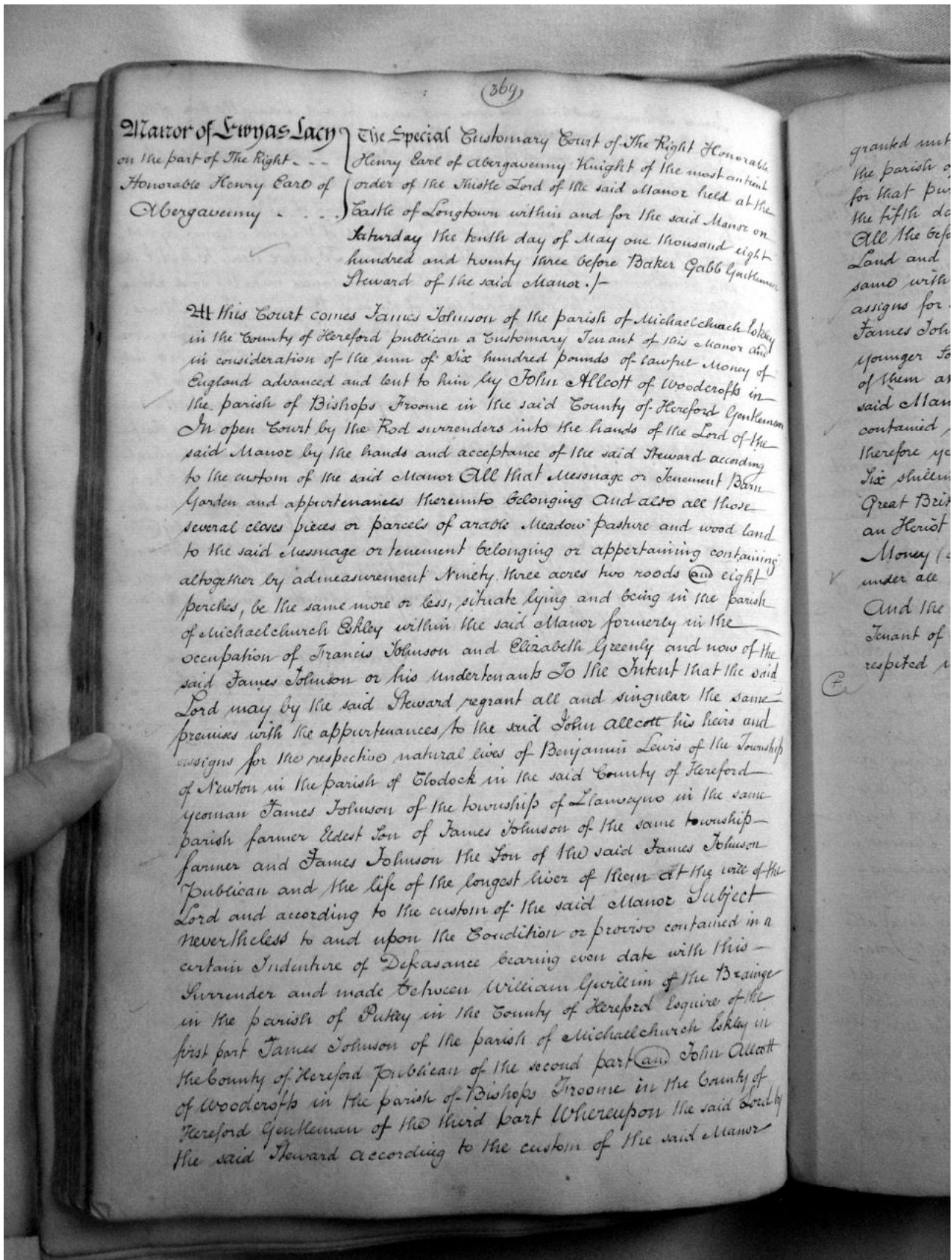

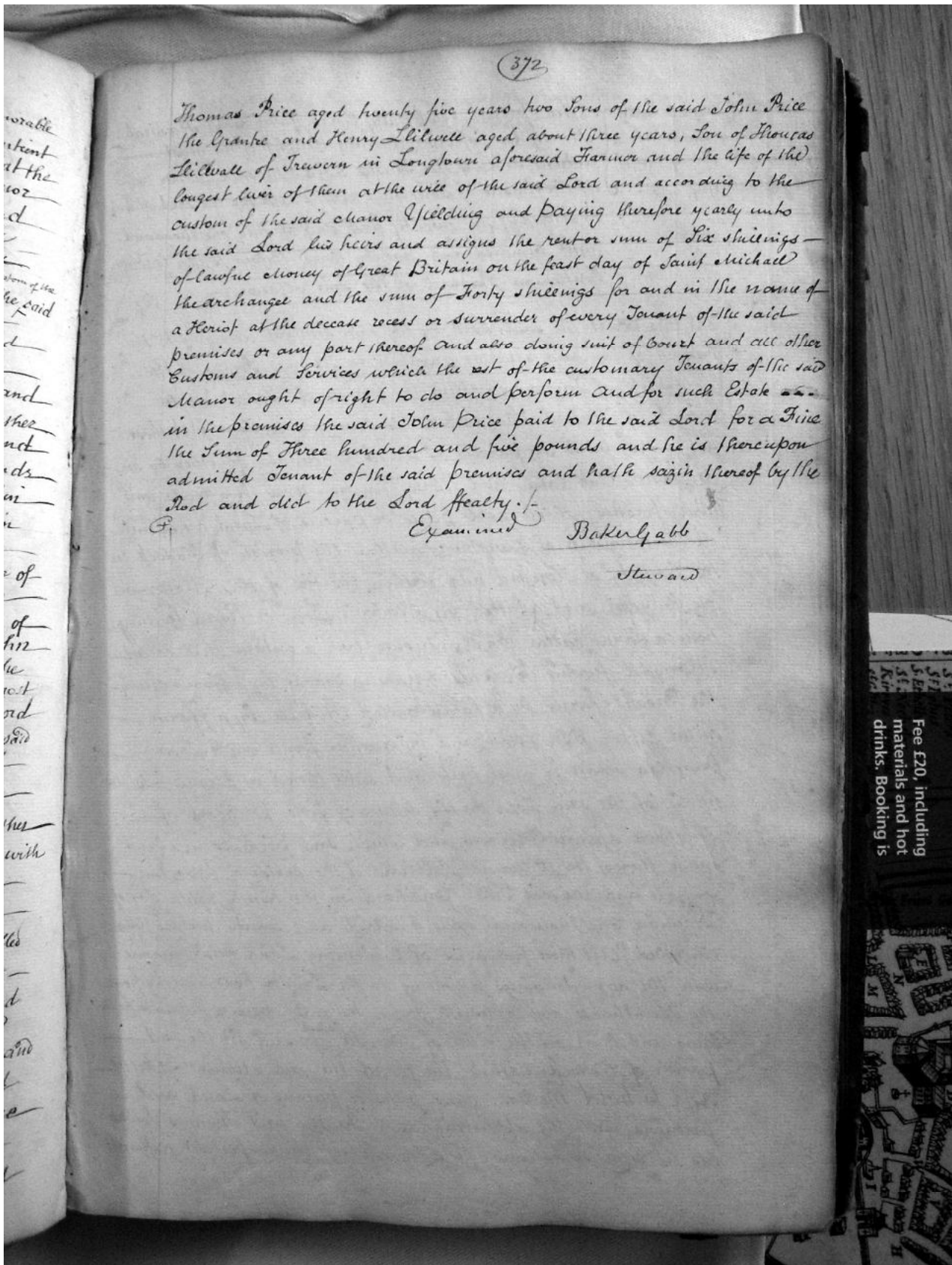
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The Special Customary Court of The Right Honorable

order of the Knights Lord of the said Manor held at the
Castle of Longtown within and for the said Manor
on Saturday the tenth day of May one thousand
eight hundred and twenty three before Baker
Esquire Gentleman Steward of the said Manor . . .

At this Court the said Lord by the said Steward according to the
Manor granted to John Price of the Maner in the Township of the
Longtown in the parish of Bredock in the said County of Hereford
farmer his heirs and assigns All that Barn and three several
Close pieces or parcels of Land arable meadow pasture wood and
rough land thereto belonging and appertaining containing together
by an admeasurement lately had thereof eighty four acres and
fifteen perches, be the same more or less, which said Barn Lands
and premises are situate in the township of Longtown within
the parish of Bredock in the said County of Hereford and within
the fee of this Manor and are bounded and abutted by the
Turnpike Road leading from Longtown aforesaid to the Village of
Michaelchurch by freehold Lands of Mr. Thomas Hodges by

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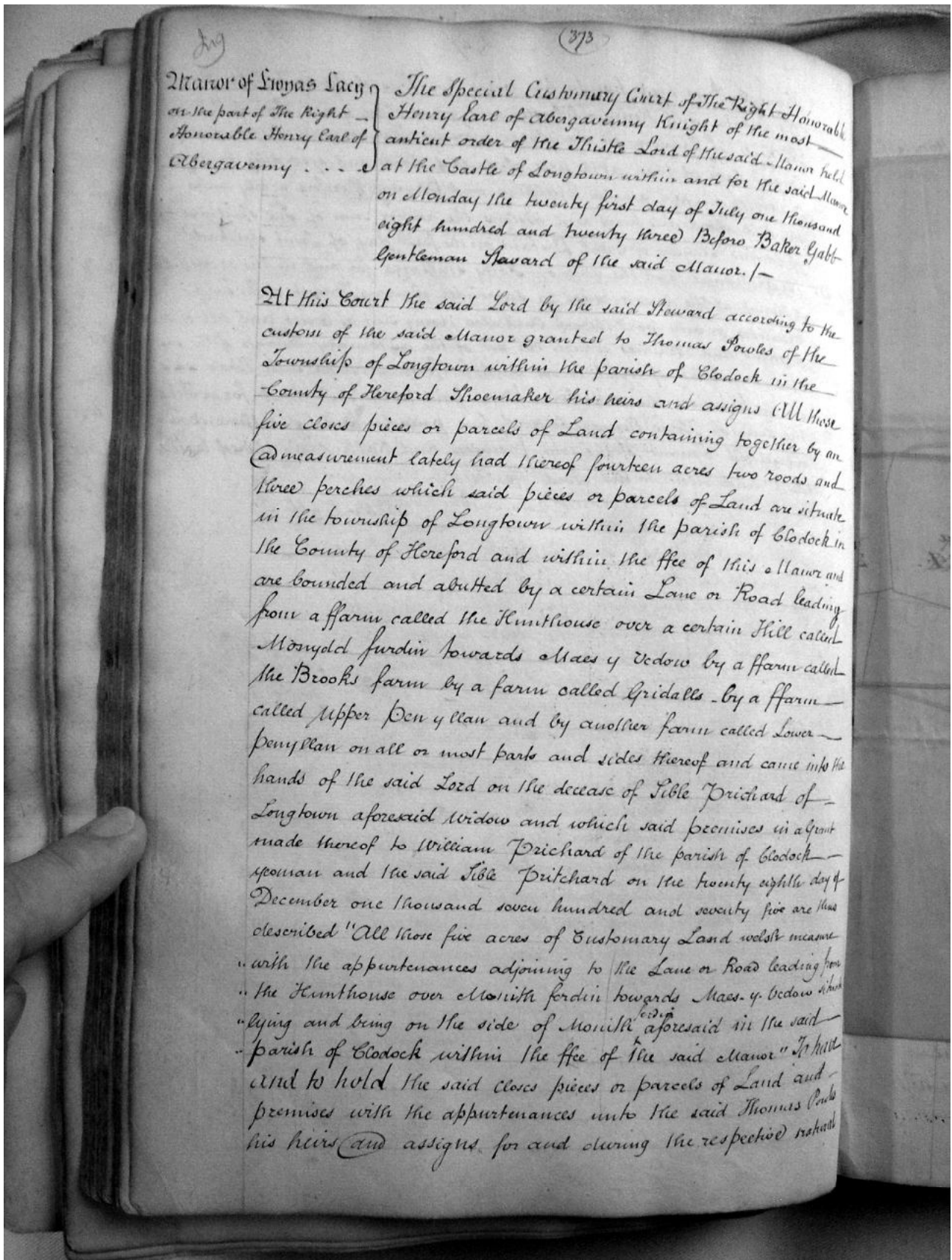
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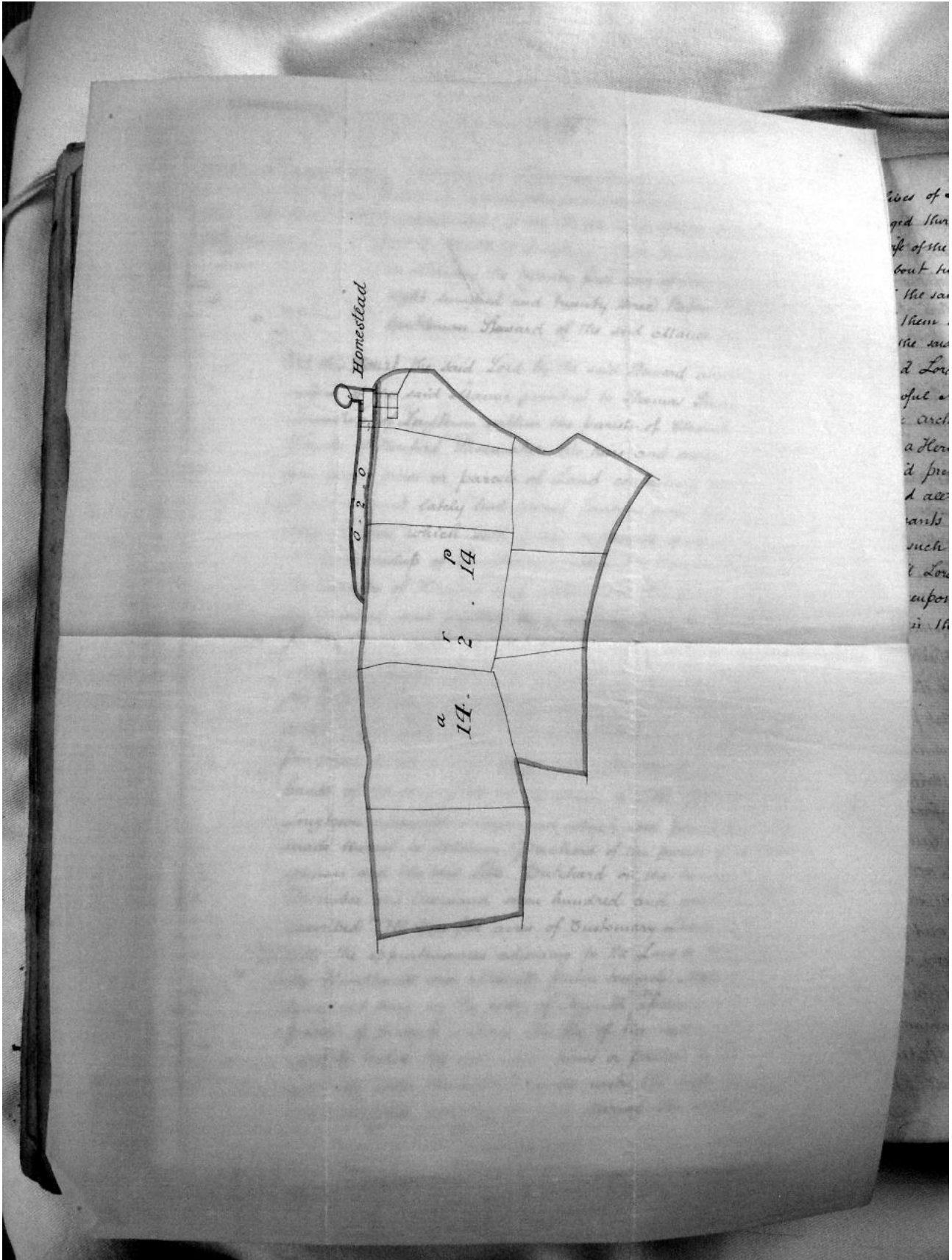

 eight hundred and twenty three Before Baker Gabb-

At this Court the said Lord by the said Steward according to the
 custom of the said Manor granted to Thomas Poles of the
 Township of Longtown within the parish of Clodock in the
 County of Hereford Shoemaker his heirs and assigns All these
 five closes pieces or parcels of Land containing together by an
 admeasurement lately had thereof fourteen acres two roods and
 three perches which said pieces or parcels of Land are situate
 in the township of Longtown within the parish of Clodock in
 the County of Hereford and within the fee of this Manor and
 are bounded and abutted by a certain Lane or Road leading
 from a farm called the Humthouse over a certain Hill called
 Monydd furdin towards Maes y Vedow by a farm called
 the Brooks farm by a farm called Gwidalls by a farm

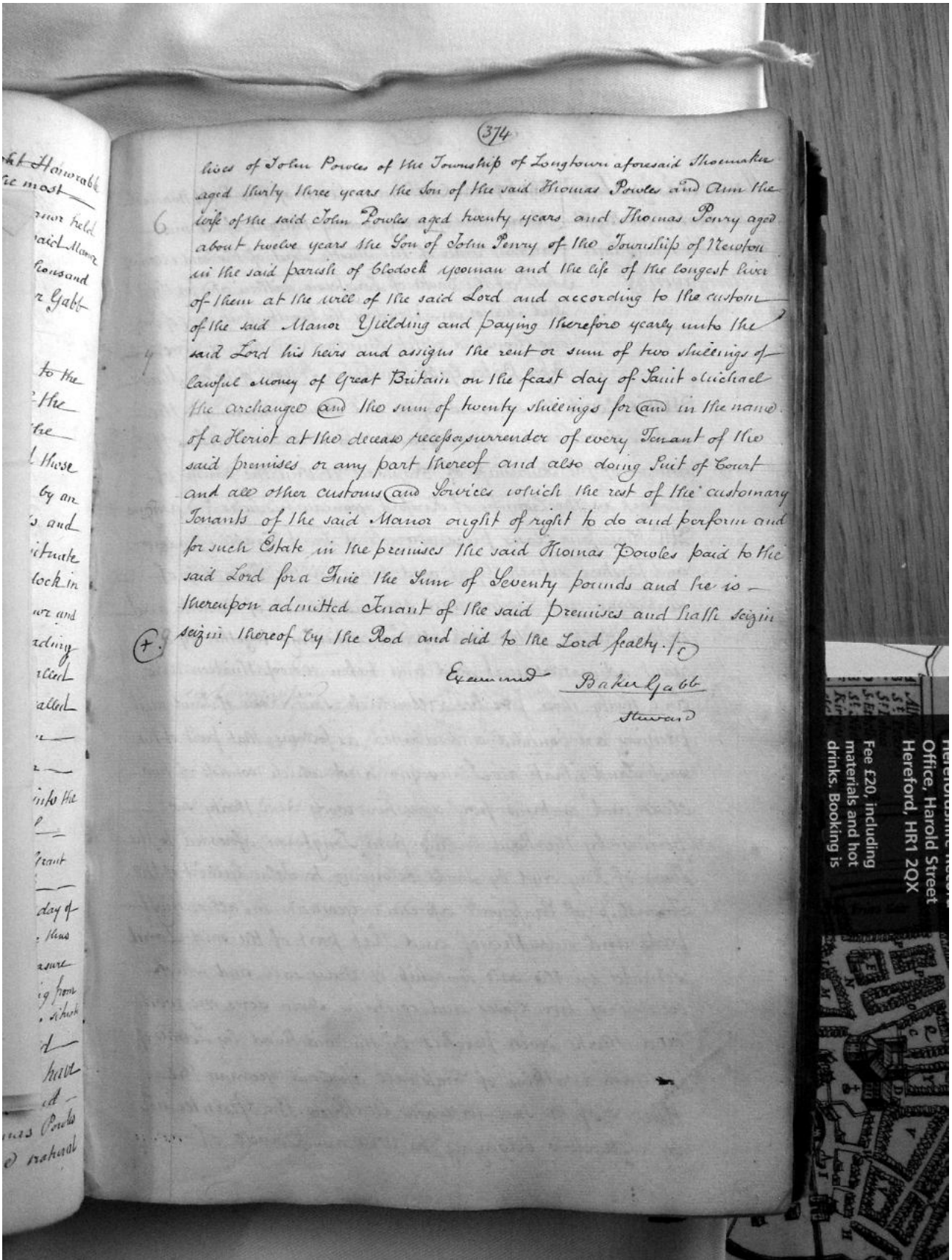
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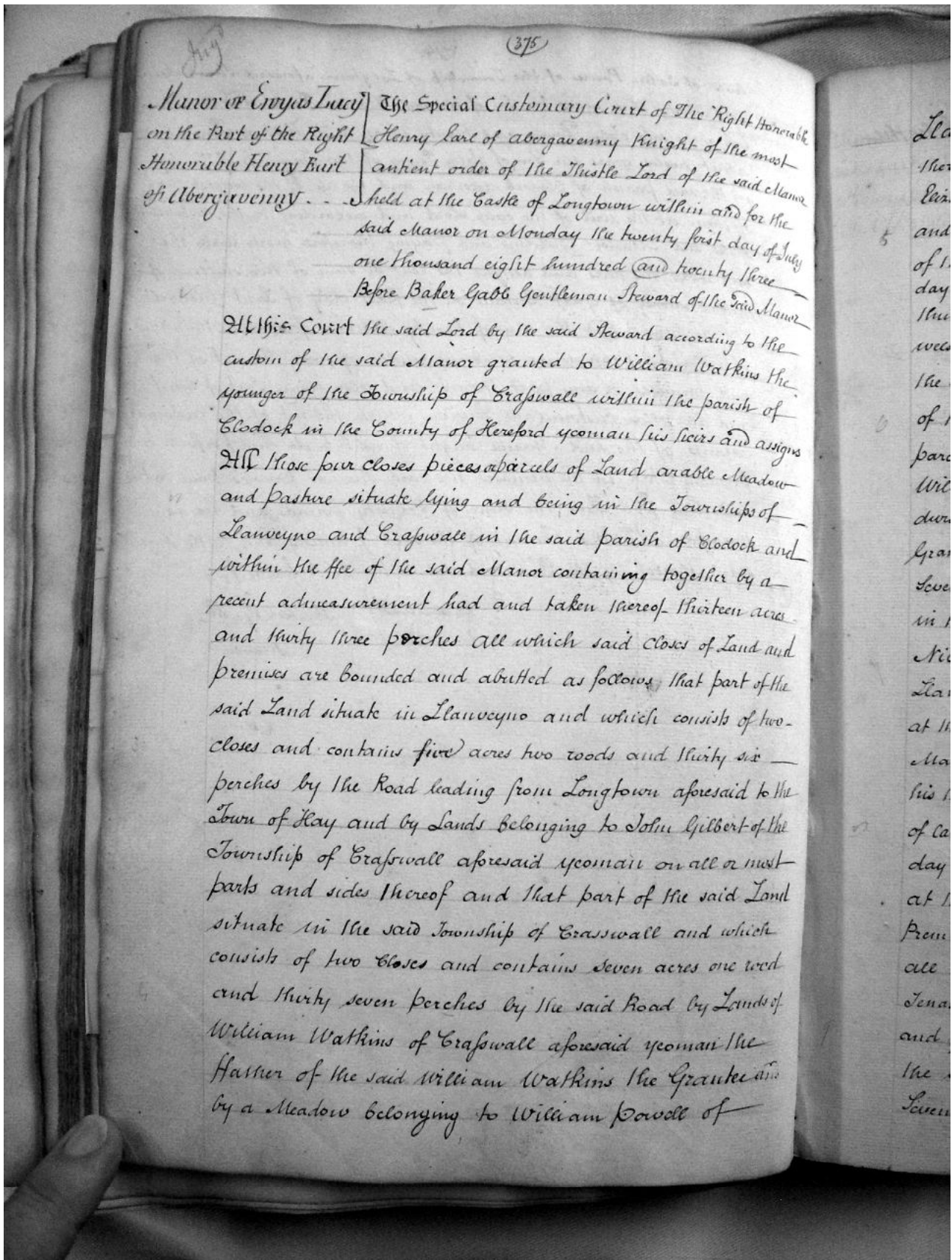
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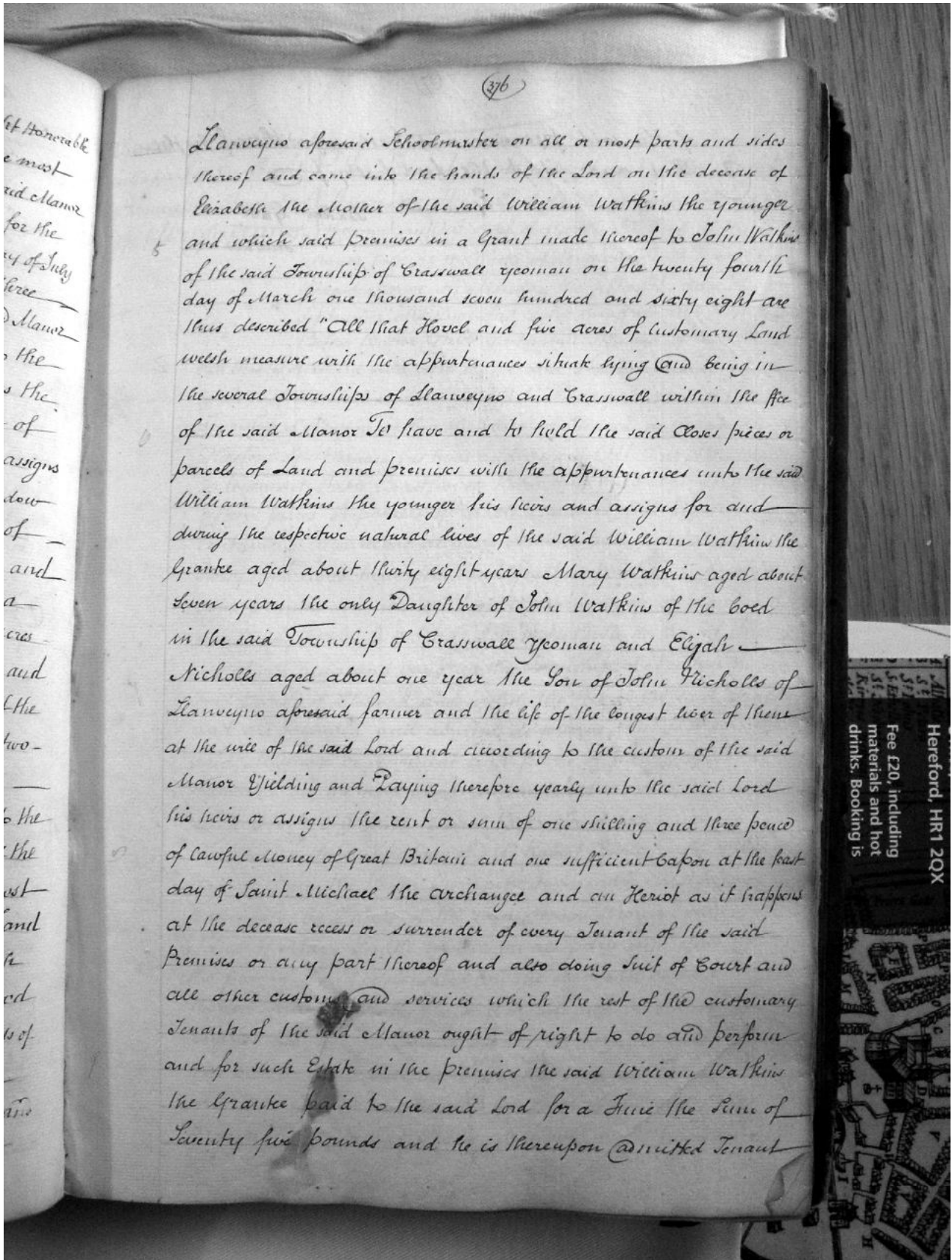
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
